Re: PennEast Pipeline Project

Dear President Miller:

The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC or Commission) invites the participation of the Stockbridge-Munsee Band of the Mohican Nation in its review of the PennEast Pipeline Project planned by PennEast Pipeline Company, LLC (PennEast), a partnership of six member companies including AGL Resources, New Jersey Resources Pipeline Company, South Jersey Industries, Public Service Electric and Gas Company Power LLC, Spectra Energy Partners, and UGI Energy Services. PennEast plans to construct about 111 miles of new natural gas pipeline in Pennsylvania and New Jersey and the project consists of the following facilities:

- 108.8 miles of new 36-inch-diameter pipeline, originating near Dallas, Luzerne County, Pennsylvania and terminating near Pennington, Mercer County, New Jersey. The pipeline route would also traverse Carbon, Northampton, and Bucks Counties, Pennsylvania, and Hunterdon and Mercer Counties, New Jersey;
- the Hellertown Lateral, a 2.1-mile, 24-inch-diameter new pipeline and Launcher/Receiver Site in Northampton County, Pennsylvania;
- Gilbert Lateral, a 0.6 mile, 12-inch-diameter in Mercer County, New Jersey;
- Lambertville Lateral, 1.3 mile, 36-inch-diameter, Mercer County, New Jersey;
- one new compressor station in Carbon County, Pennsylvania;
- interconnects in Luzerne and Carbon Counties, Pennsylvania and Hunterdon and Mercer Counties, New Jersey; and
- seven mainline block valves at locations along the planned pipeline segments in Luzerne, Carbon, and Northampton Counties, Pennsylvania and Hunterdon County, New Jersey.

On October 10, 2014, FERC approved PennEast's request to begin the Commission's pre-filing process, which enables review of the project to begin before an application is filed with FERC. The purpose of the pre-filing process is to seek public and agency input early in the project planning phase and encourage involvement by interested stakeholders in a manner that allows for the early identification and resolution of environmental issues.

Enclosed is the *Notice of Intent to Prepare an Environmental Assessment for the Planned PennEast Pipeline Project, Request for Comments on Environmental Issues, and Notice of Public Scoping Meeting* (NOI) on January 13, 2015. The NOI included a brief description of the project and the Commission's decision-making process. It was published in the *Federal Register* and placed in the Commission's public record under docket number PF15-1-000.¹

You may have been contacted about the project by PennEast or their consultants, URS/AECOM. Although the company does not represent the FERC, they can assist us in completing the process of complying with section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act by gathering information, in accordance with the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation's implementing regulations at 36 CFR 800.2(a)(3).

We are interested in receiving your comments on the project to ensure that the concerns of the Stockbridge-Munsee Band of the Mohican Nation are identified and properly considered in our environmental analysis. We also request your assistance in identifying the Tribe's properties of traditional, religious, or cultural importance that may be affected by the planned Project. Please be assured that we will keep any sensitive tribal information strictly confidential.

You may file a response either electronically or with a paper copy; however, with either method please reference the project docket number (PF15-1-000) with your submission.
