Dear Secretary Bose:

It is apparent that the Garden State Expansion Project is but one segment of an interconnected pipeline system consisting of it, the PennEast pipeline, Crestwood Marc II and the Southern Reliability Link. These four projects are interdependent upon one another for delivery of a daily capacity of 180,000 dekatherms of supply from PennEast and should be reviewed by FERC as a single project.

FERC must consider the cumulative harm of these interdependent projects to all aspects of the environment and other resources. The Garden State Expansion Project Environmental Assessment does not address these overall impacts. The only way to adequately address the collective impacts of the segments of this aggregate is to require a cumulative Environmental Impact Statement analysis of the PennEast pipeline, the Crestwood Marc II pipeline, the Garden State Expansion Project, and the Southern Reliability Link Project properly considered as a whole.

Our organization opposes the segment-by-segment review of these interdependent parts of the same pipeline system.
