Enjoy Free Talking Books Delivered to Your Home If your ability to read has been affected by vision loss or impairment, a physical handicap such as a stroke, or a learning disability, the New Jersey State Library Talking Book & Braille Center (TBBC) can help. You don't need to be legally blind to use these free statewide services, just unable to read standard print with corrective lenses. NFB-NEWSLINE offers access to over 300 audio newspapers and magazines, including Spanish language and titles such as The New York Times and AARP the Magazine. TBBC's own Audiovision newspaper reading service offers seven New Jersey newspapers. Audiovision is available in your home by tuning your TV to NJN's designated subchannel for your cable carrier. Although you may have lost your vision, you don't need to lose your love of reading.
