Senior Freeze Property Tax Reimbursement Deadline Extended to November 1. New applicants will not receive benefits this year, but they should apply to establish their eligibility for benefits in future years. Current participant whose income for 2009 does not exceed last year's income limit of \$70,000 will receive a reimbursement this year if they continue to meet the eligibility requirements. Reimbursement checks for eligible senior and disabled residents who filed their 2009 applications by the original filing deadline of June 1 were scheduled to be mailed on or about July 15, 2010. New applicants will not receive a payment in fiscal 2011, but should apply anyway because doing so will establish a base year when applying for a reimbursement in future years.
